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## A Note From the Founder <u>Happy June!</u>

A new fiscal year is beginning and with it, some good news! The Medicaid reimbursement rates for companion, respite and attendant care providers will be increased by 2% effective 7/1/2015. This means that people who were making \$8.86 and \$11.47/hour will be increased to \$9.04 and \$11.70/hour respectively. Also, two counties which were designated as rest of state are being moved to the Northern Virginia designation; Culpeper and Rapphannock.

## Medicaid's Move to Managed Care

There are also some big changes coming to the way Medicaid's medical and long term care services are managed for individuals on waivers. Please take time read and understand the changes that are being proposed. Now is the time to test our advocacy and policy muscles.

This is taken from DMAS's website: "Consistent with Virginia General Assembly directives in years 2011 through 2015, the Department of Medical Assistance Services (DMAS) is moving forward with proposed initiatives 'to expand principles of care coordination to all geographic areas, populations, and services under programs administered by the department. The expansion of care coordination shall be based on the principles of shared financial risk such as shared savings, performance benchmarks or risk and improving the value of care delivered by measuring outcomes, enhancing quality, and monitoring expenditures. - "(DMAS).

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# What You and Your Service Facilitator Should be Discussing

### 1. New for this period:

- 1. Would "If I Need Help" be helpful for you? "Help for our loved ones who may wonder or need assistance!...When a [loved one] is found they often are unable to identify themselves and do not ask for help or carry an ID. " How it works Free Membership, self created profile, choose item(s) with your unique QC code on it, etc.. Let your service facilitator know if you'd like an account we can send your contact info to If I Need Help and they will create and account for you :-). Use Promo Code "Moms" to receive5% of of your initial purchase.
- 2. Who is your Primary Care Physician? If we do not have this on file, we need to update our information.

#### 1. At every visit:

- Are you enrolled in <u>Commonwealth Coordinated Care (CCC)</u>? If so, which Managed Care Organization (MCO) are you using? CCC is an optional program for individuals who are served by both Medicare and Medicaid and meet other requirements. If you are enrolled, please let us know as you enroll, change MCO's or opt out. We have to get your hours re-authorized in each and every case.
- Any medical and/or functional changes. It is important to keep your service facilitator informed of any changes, big or small. This includes changes in medications, behavior, orientation, diagnoses, or abilities. Keeping this information up to date will ensure you and your loved ones are receiving the highest quality care.
- 3. Who are your attendants and are they getting paid? Please be sure to update your service facilitator immediately if your attendants are not getting paid and you have not had luck troubleshooting with PPL. The quicker we can work together to get this corrected, the better for all involved :-)
- 4. Have there been any recent hospitalizations? -
  - If you have stayed in a hospital for more than 30 days or an inpatient rehabilitation center/nursing facility/mental health facility for 1 or more days, your services could be interrupted. This is why it is important to keep your service facilitator in the know. Please note ER visits do not count as hospitalizations, but are helpful to mention as part of the medical updates.
- 5. Turning 18 We have an amazing <u>resource page</u> for young adults on our website. All of these issues and more are addressed there. If your child is turning 18 or just turned it's a must read! Important steps to take to make sure there is no lapse in your waiver services. You must get a disability determination to keep your waiver!

## Information to Increase EDCD Waiver Screening Success

For those individuals who are considering getting screened for the EDCD waiver, or have been screened and denied, using this Medicaid Memo can help achieve approval. This memo outlines that if the client has documentation from their attending physician, stating that the individual is at imminent risk, and needs services, then the individual should be approved. To further assist in the screening process, individuals should bring this documentation with the Medicaid Memo to the screening. Individuals can use this model letter as a guide for their primary physician to use.

# July 1 = New Fiscal Year = Refreshed bucket of respite hours.

Remember, respite begins a new allowance with each fiscal year. If you are eligible for respite, you will have a "fresh bucket" of 480 hours which you can utilize between 7/1/15 and 6/30/16.



#### Waiver Redesign Update for ID/DD Clients

Recently, the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services discussed upcoming waiver redesign for clients across the ID/DD Spectrum. The proposed waiver redesign would apply to the following waivers:

- Intellectual Disability Waiver
- Day Support Waiver
- Developmental Disabilities Waiver

The proposed changes are to address realignment of the current three waivers, to a system that supports individuals across the spectrum, addresses changing needs, and balances resources. Redesign recommendations include changes to existing services such as, increase on the daily limit of companion hours and increase on the annual limit of respite hours. Recommended new services include:

- Shared Living- provide payment for rent and food for a person who resides in the same residence as the individual
- Non-Medical Transportation- Transportation to enable individuals to gain access to waiver and other community services or events, inclusive of transportation to employment or volunteer sites
- Private Duty Nursing- Individual and continuous care (in contrast to part-time or intermittent care) provided by licensed nurses at an individuals place of residence

Additionally, the VA Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS) has completed its review of comments submitted in response to the proposed provider rates for services provided through the Intellectual Disability (ID), Individual and Family Developmental Disabilities Support (DD), and Day Support waiver programs. # **Certain Medicaid Waiver Payments Could be Exempt from Income Tax**

The IRS Notice 2014-7 provides guidance of the federal income tax treatment of certain payments to individual care providers for the care of eligible individuals on Medicaid waivers.

This means that if you are the paid attendant for an adult child, living in your home, then your pay could be exempt from income tax. For full details, visit here.

Consumer-Directed Assistant and for people who need a Consumer-Directed Assistant. People wanting to become assistants can list their skills, availability, location, and contact information. People with disabilities that need assistants can search for a person to work with them that matches their needs.

The Arc of Northern Virginia has put together an incredible document to introduce individuals to consumer direction. Starting on page 8 of the document, there are very valuable insights into finding and managing qualified care providers. (Remember they are located in Northern VA, so the reimbursement rate is only relevant to NVA.)
