Update on Virginia's Settlement Agreement

In August 2012, the Commonwealth of Virginia entered into a Settlement Agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) based on DOJ's

findings that the Commonwealth was in violation of the most integrated setting tenets of the Americans with Disabilities Act and the U.S. Supreme Court decision in Olmstead v. L.C. as related to the provision of services and supports to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

On June 15, 2015, the U.S. Department of Justice sent a <u>letter</u> to Federal Judge John Gibney outlining concerns about the Commonwealth's implementation of the U.S. v Virginia Settlement Agreement and requesting an open hearing to address areas of non-compliance. The letter follows a (June 6, 2014) <u>report from the Independent Reviewer</u>, which found the Commonwealth to be out of compliance in several areas including children's crisis, opportunities to live in the most integrated settings, subsidized community living options and employment/integrated day services.

The DOJ Independent Reviewer's <u>6th Semiannual Report</u> (June 6, 2015) that details areas Virginia is and is not in compliance with the agreement.

A **status hearing** regarding the U.S. v. Virginia Settlement Agreement has been scheduled for October 23rd at 10:00 am at the Federal Courthouse in Richmond. This is the first hearing regarding implementation of the U.S. v. Virginia Settlement Agreement, and it will be **open to the public**.

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What You and Your Service Facilitator Should be Discussing

1. New for this period:

1. Approval process for EDCD and DD Waivers changing. -

As per DMAS, the third party authorization provider of these services and many other Medicaid services will only be accepting requests via their web portal beginning September 1. The intention of this change is to reduce the time required to process requests. Moms In Motion is concerned and has expressed this concern to DMAS, etc. that KePRO's portal may not be able to handle the load of requests coming in. We've been assured that they are prepared. Just note, there maybe or may not be some bumps in the short-term road ahead. If we experience delays due this change, we will do our best to advocate for improvements to the system and communicate with you the status of the system change.

2. At every visit:

1. Are you enrolled in Commonwealth Coordinated Care (CCC)? If so,

which Managed Care Organization (MCO) are you using? -

CCC is an optional program for individuals who are served by both Medicare and Medicaid and meet other requirements. If you are enrolled, please let us know as you enroll, change MCO's or opt out. We have to get your hours re-authorized in each and every case.

- Any medical and/or functional changes. -It is important to keep your service facilitator informed of any changes, big or small. This includes changes in medications, behavior, orientation, diagnoses, or abilities. Keeping this information up to date will ensure you and your loved ones are receiving the highest quality care.
- 3. Who are your attendants and are they getting paid? Please be sure to update your service facilitator immediately if your attendants are not getting paid and you have not had luck troubleshooting with PPL. The quicker we can work together to get this corrected, the better for all involved :-)
- 4. Have there been any recent hospitalizations? If you have stayed in a hospital for more than 30 days or an inpatient rehabilitation center/nursing facility/mental health facility for 1 or more days, your services could be interrupted. This is why it is important to keep your service facilitator in the know. Please note ER visits do not count as hospitalizations, but are helpful to mention as part of the medical updates.
- 5. **Turning 18 -** We have an amazing <u>resource page</u> for young adults on our website. All of these issues and more are addressed there. If your child is turning 18 or just turned it's a must read! Important steps to take to make sure there is no lapse in your waiver services. You must get a disability determination to keep your waiver!

*Please note: your service facilitator should be seeing you at least every 30, 60, or 90 days. If not, please alert the <u>Division Manager</u> in your area.

Waiver Slots Released!

In its latest update to stakeholders, the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS) reported that there are now more than 10,000 individuals with I/DD who are on waiting lists for the ID and DD Waiver programs. It is estimated that more than 50% of these individuals are in urgent need. The state budget approved by the General Assembly made 325 ID Waiver slots and 40 DD Waiver slots available on July 1, 2015. The new slots provided by the Governor and General Assembly will serve 3.5% of the I/DD Waiver waiting list.

Waiver Redesign Update

Beginning July 2016, the Commonwealth will be launching a new I/DD Waiver program for Virginians with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The program will replace the existing Intellectual Disability (ID) Waiver and Developmental Disability (DD) Waiver with three new waivers:

- Community Living (CL) Waiver
- Individual and Family Support (IFS) Waiver
- Building Independence (BI) Waiver

Individuals currently receiving ID/DD Waiver services will be offered the opportunity to choose which of these three Waivers they will receive when they transition into the new program. Maximizing Your Benefits

Individual and Family Support Program (IFSP) Update

Message from Bob Villa of <u>Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS)</u>: Round Two of the FY 2015 ISFP application process has been completed. 1885 applications were received. \$1.5 million was used to assist 597 persons.

The regional breakdown of accepted applications is as follows: HPR I 96, HPR II 157, HPR III 88, HPR IV 136, HPR V 120

All applicants received written notification of the funding decisions, and were asked to complete a short survey. Results from the survey will be posted on the IFSP Web-site later this year.

The particulars for the FY2016 round of funding have not been determined. A workgroup has now been established comprised mostly of individuals, and their family members, who are currently on the waitlists for the Individual and Family Developmental Disabilities (DD) Waiver and the Intellectual Disabilities (ID) Waiver. The mission of the workgroup will be to redesign the IFSP and develop a coordinated supports model as required in the DOJ Settlement Agreement.

Respite Voucher Program

<u>Virginia Department for Aging and Rehabilitative Services (DARS)</u> offers temporary voucher program for <u>Respite Care Lifespan</u> Respite Voucher Program. Voucher funding is limited to a total of \$400 per family. Voucher funding will continue until August 31, 2015 or when funds are expended.

SSI Disability and Employment Benefits Assistance

Marilyn Morrison, Community Work Incentives Counselors for vaACCSES, will be offering free consultations to help families through the SSI process to problem solve and answer questions about benefits planning, analysis, advisement, benefits assistance, support planning, information and referral or other questions regarding employment goals.

Changes and Updates from the HIPP Programs

HIPP and HIPP for Kids are two Medicaid programs that may reimburse part or a participant's entire share of the employer sponsored group health insurance premiums. It is extremely important to report changes in order to receive timely reimbursement and avoid suspension or cancellation from the HIPP Programs.

- Changes need to be reported within 10 days of the date the change occurred.
- Some examples are: address, health insurance plan, or employment status changes.
- HIPP Program reimbursement checks cannot be forwarded. If you
 have moved and failed to report an address change the
 reimbursement check will be returned to the HIPP Unit.

Advocacy

The Community Integration Act (CIA)

A new proposal in the U.S. Senate would eliminate a government bias toward placing people with disabilities in institutional rather than community-based settings. The Community Integration Act would change things by requiring that states deem all individuals who are considered eligible for institutional care to also be eligible for supports in home and community-based settings. What's more, the bill would prohibit states from making people ineligible for services in the community based on their particular disability.

Right now is the time to <u>advocate</u> to your Representatives in the US Congress while they're back home in their local district offices for the Community Integration Act.

Cuts to Developmental Disabilities Programs by Senate

The US Senate is cutting funding to MANY programs, such as Protection and Advocacy, DD Councils such as the Virginia Board for People with Disabilities, and special education (IDEA) programs.

IRS's Regulations on the ABLE Act - Public Comment

The rule-making process of implementation of the Stephen Beck, Jr., Achieving a Better Life Experience Act of 2014 is moving forward. Section 529A of the IRS Code provides rules under which States or State agencies or instrumentalities may establish and maintain this new type of tax savings program through which contributions may be made to the account of an eligible individual with a disability to meet qualified disability expenses. Public comment must be received by September 21, 2015. A public hearing will be held on October 14. For more information see the Federal Register Notice of
