

Important notification from DMAS:

Overtime & Live-in Exemptions

Overtime

- Effective January 1, 2021 attendants may work up to 8 hours of overtime per work week (overtime is considered any hours over 40hours in a week; max total attendants can work is 48hrs (40hrs regular - 8hrs overtime).
 - Only Attendants who <u>do not live with the member</u> are eligible for overtime payments.
 - The attendant may not exceed the member's bi-weekly authorized hours.
- If an attendant qualifies for overtime, the attendant must use an approved EVV method including the EVV mobile application or IVR system.
- DMAS is finalizing a Medicaid Memo regarding the upcoming EVV live-in exemption and overtime changes.
- Overtime rates are expected to be \$19.17 for Northern Virginia and \$14.81 for Rest of State.














Live-In Exemption

- Effective January 1, 2021 attendants who live with the member are eligible for the Electronic Visit Verification (EVV) Live-in Exemption. Live-in attendants may use all forms of electronic time entry methods including the online portal, EVV mobile application, and IVR system.
- If you are a current live-in attendant, you will be required to provide proof of address.
 - Forms of proof of address can include but are not limited to driver's license, voter registration card, banking statement, credit card statement, utility bill statement, or cell phone bill statement.
- New attendants starting January 1, 2021 will be required to provide proof of address during the enrollment process.
- Existing live-in attendants have until June 30, 2021, to provide proof of address. The Fiscal/ Employer Agent (F/EA) will provide details on how to submit documents for verification. Attendants that do not send in the required documents will no longer be considered live-ins and must comply with all EVV requirements.
- Attendants cannot qualify for overtime and live in exemption.





Tell Your Services Facilitator

Changes to your MCO, Health Insurance Premium Payment (HIPP) Program Enrollment, or Medicaid eligibility affects your authorization for Personal Care, Respite, and Companion hours. Moms In Motion needs to know where to send authorization requests to. Your Service Facilitator is often one of the last to know about these types of changes. You must have an authorization in place with the appropriate entity and fiscal agent in order for your attendant to work and get paid. Don't risk a lapse in services.

If you receive a balance notice or Explanation of Benefits (EOB) statement:

- Building Independence (BI)
- Community Living (CL)
- Family and Individual Supports (FIS)

MONTHLY DISCUSSION WITH YOUR SERVICE FACILITATOR



1. New for this period:


- If you made changes to your MCO during Open Enrollment, your changes are effective 1/1/2021. Please be aware of the impacts this may have on
 - the person's authorizations and attendant pay.
 - the Fiscal Agent and new paperwork requirements
- If you did not make any changes during Open Enrollment, nothing should change for your case.

2. At every visit:

- Are you eligible for <u>HIPP for Kids/HIPP</u>?
- Has there been a change to the the Employer of Record (EOR)?
- Have your level of care needs changed since our last visit?
- Any recent hospitalizations?









MAXIMIZING YOUR BENEFITS



Renewing Your Medicaid



Individuals on the CCC Plus & both of the DD Waivers (CL/FIS) are required to renew their Medicaid annually. A paper renewal application is usually mailed to the primary residence the month before the individual's renewal month. You will not be required to have another screening.



• When completing the renewal application, only include information regarding the individual requesting Medicaid.



Write "CCC Plus/Long Term Care" at the top of the form.



• Section 5: Renewal of coverage in future years (optional) – to make it easier to determine your eligibility for help paying for health coverage in future years, you can agree to allow the Medicaid or FAMIS programs or the Marketplace to use income data, including information from tax returns. You will not receive a renewal application. Instead, you will receive notification of the outcome of your renewal. 5 years is the maximum number of years allowed.





DURING COVID-19



We recommend completing the renewal paperwork if possible. However, according to the latest **DMAS memo released 8/5/2020**:



- Eligibility and Enrollment
 - With the announcement of the extension of the federal public health declaration, continuity of coverage must remain until October 22, **2020** for Medicaid members, and no adverse action will be taken on Medicaid cases through that date.

Key Roles in a Medicaid Waiver

SERVICE FACILITATOR:

A Consumer-Directed (CD) Services Facilitator (SF) is the DMAS-enrolled provider who is responsible for supporting the individual and family/caregiver by ensuring the development and monitoring of the consumer-directed services plan of care, providing attendant management training, and

completing ongoing review activities as required by DMAS for consumer-



EMPLOYER OF RECORD:

directed personal care and respite services.

The Employer of Record (EOR) is the person who performs the functions of the employer in the consumer-directed model of service delivery. The EOR may be the individual enrolled in the waiver, or a family member, caregiver, or another person.

FISCAL AGENT(S):



The Fiscal Employer Agent performs payroll activities on behalf of the EOR. This allows the individual to use waiver funds to hire and pay attendants. The Managed Care Organization (MCO) contracts with the Fiscal Employer Agent to ensure that payment to the attendant is accurate based on approved service authorizations and timesheets that have been approved by the EOR. The Fiscal Employer Agent keeps payment records and follows all tax rules on the EOR's behalf. The EOR employs the attendant(s).

ATTENDANT(S):

The attendant is an individual who provides personal care or supports for the waiver individual. The attendant is the individual hired by the Employer of Record (EOR) who provides CD personal assistance, respite services, or companion services to the individual. The attendant provides services that are authorized by DMAS or its designated service authorization agent. The attendant should have the knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform the functions and duties necessary to support the individual who is receiving services.


